Role Purpose

Assist in the conservation and usage of parklands and park resources, ensure visitors at the location follow posted rules, laws, and regulations and that they remain safe during their visit or stay.

Key Responsibilities and Accountabilities

- 1. Patrol parks on foot or in a vehicle, inspect park premises to ensure they are in good order, clean and tidy ready for visitors.
- 2. Lead visitors on a tour to provide information about a park, highlight park features, wildlife, landmarks and historic relevance or landmarks.
- 3. Enforce Park rules ensuring visitors comply with established fire and safety guidelines and other park rules and procedures.
- 4. Watch and regulate the number of visitors in a park, visitor centres, overnight camps, or car park to manage congestion and capacity.
- 5. Respond to complaints or antisocial activity within park facilities, carry out initial investigation and resolve or escalate as required to ensure public safety.
- 6. Carry out scheduled grounds maintenance, for example repair and upkeep of pathways, fencing, trails, such that park facilities are in good order and safe for use by the public, to ensure park structures and facilities remain safe, are a pleasant and engaging space and are efficient.
- 7. Administer first aid to injured visitors prior to medical intervention.



About this Role

This is an entry level for a park ranger, at this level the ranger is accountable for patrolling the park and maintains park standards. Park standards include,

- Visual aspects of the park.
- Health of park environment.
- Safety of park facilities, including providing first aid.
- Monitoring and control visitor numbers.

Park rangers typically a good knowledge of biology and an interest in the environment, knowledge of the geography, history ecology and culture of a park and excellent customer and communications skills.
